Description

Typical of the 1925-30 period is this aluminum sided frame bungalow, said to be a Sears catalogue house. It is a one-and-a-half story structure with a deep porch beneath an overhang, and shed-roofed dormers front and rear. The porch columns are stuccoed and may indicate the original finish of this house. A small frame garage with bi-fold doors is located behind the house.

There are several bungalows in Keedysville, located at the edges of town. They may have been retirement homes for local farmers.


