Description

Taylor Park, belonging to the Town of Keedysville, was established in 1934. Resources from its early period include a stone retaining wall along Main Street and a rustic log pavilion. These features were constructed as a WPA project. Other pavilions and playground equipment have been added more recently, as well as a World War II memorial.

Sixty-year old Taylor Park was established for the citizens of Keedysville and represents the result of Depression-era work programs. It is located on the site of the original Jacob Hess farm.




