Description

Located a short distance north of Mt. Hebron Road, this house is a two story, four bay frame building with German siding. The front door is in the second bay from the south end. Windows have six over six pane sash. A two bay entrance porch is supported by chamfered posts with decorative brackets.

This house is typical of late 19th century vernacular construction of the region, showing Germanic influence. According to local informants, it was built for Peter Kretzer.


