DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mt. Carmel Church of the United Bretheren in Christ is a one story brick structure, three bays long and one bay wide. It is constructed in common bond at all elevations. The wall surfaces are accented by brick corbeling and projecting vertical areas suggesting pilasters. A half round fan light is located in the entrance gable above a door with a transom and wide wooden lintel. Windows with similar lintels have twelve over eight pane sashes. A Victorian belfry is centered on the roof above the door. At the time it was photographed in 1973 the church was painted red. It has since been painted white.


