This farmhouse is a two story, five bay brick structure with a two story brick topped with frame wing extending to the rear. The facade wall was laid in Flemish bond while other elevations use common bond. The main entrance is centered in the front wall. The door is hung beneath a four light transom. Behind the house is a barn and an out kitchen with an exterior stone and brick chimney.


