Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The frame house is a one-story frame structure constructed in a rectangular plan. It is a three-bay by two-bay building with a gable roof that flairs out in the rear to cover the rear bay in the front for a full-length, one-story porch. The main facade is symmetrically arranged with a central entrance and one-over-one sash windows in the outer bays. The exterior is covered in asphalt siding. The structure appears to date from the early 20th century.

The property is located on the north side of Sandy Hook Road, approximately .2 mile west of Clark Road, in Sandy Hook. The house sits close to the road. The main facade faces south.

The one-story structure is constructed in a cottage style with a gable roof that flairs out in the front to cover a full-length porch and in the back to cover a full-length bay. The structure is built on the ground with no foundation story. It is constructed of frame covered in asphalt siding. The main facade has a central entrance and one-over-one sash windows with plain trim in the outer bays of the first story. The windows have a modern style shutter ornamentation. The gable ends have one-over-one windows with a four-pane window in the gable. The rear has a smaller one-over-one window. The front porch is supported by square posts. The gable has a large boxed cornice. The roof is covered in asphalt siding.

There are no significant outbuildings on the property.






