DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This brick house, part of a farm complex, is a two story, five bay L-shaped structure. Flemish bond was used at the front elevation while other walls have common bonding. Nine over six pane windows are used at both the first and second story levels. The main entrance is centered in the front elevation and has an oval transom. Secondary entrances are located in an end wall and in the ell. Interior trim includes door architraves with decorated corner blocks. A large frame bank barn is located near the house.


