DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is a two story, three bay structure with a central cross gable having a palladian window. Although the house is completely sheathed with siding, the owner reports that the two western bays are of log construction while the east section is a frame addition built shortly after 1900. These renovations were made by the father of the present owner who purchased the farm about 1898. Also part of the complex is a frame bank barn which also would appear to date from about 1900, a brick smoke house and various other agricultural and domestic outbuildings.


