DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This complex includes a two story, five bay brick house, a secondary dwelling, said to be of log construction, and a log and stone spring house and out kitchen, and a large frame bank barn. The house has a common bond at all elevations with six over six pane windows at both the first and second story levels. The central entrance includes a broad transome and side lights around the door. An early 20th century front porch is also present. The springhouse stands on high stone foundations with its upper half story built of logs.
