
30 North Main Street is a west-facing, horizontally massed, symmetrical, one-and-a-half-story, three-bay, freestanding, log residential structure resting on a stone foundation. The building, which is covered with manufactured siding, is sited directly at the public right-of-way. The side gable roof is covered with artificial shingles and has a center, brick chimney. The fenestration consists of single, rectangular, wooden sash, double-hung, two-over-two windows. The center-bay entrance is protected by a porch running the length of the house and supported by wrought-iron posts. The front door is glazed and panelled. There is a small shed-roof addition on the rear of the building.

The building is set on original lot 55, a vacant lot that is not listed on the key to the 1814 plat of the town. A building does appear on the 1875 map on a lot which was then owned by Mrs. I. Flory. The 1916 and 1923 Sanborns note that this is a log structure, then numbered 166 Main Street.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.



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


E. SCHOOL LANE
