62 South Main Street is an east-facing, horizontally massed, symmetrical, one-and-a-half-story, two-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure resting on a concrete(?) foundation. The building is covered with manufactured siding, as is the side gable roof. The entrance, located in the south bay, is protected by a deep, hipped roof open portico supported by two turned posts. The door is a glazed and panelled one. Windows are rectangular, double-hung, one-over-one sash with shutters. There is a small one-story addition to the rear.

The building is set on original lot 10, a vacant lot that was owned by Thomas Foster, according to the 1814 plat of the town. A building appears on the site, then owned by the Robinson heirs, on the 1875 town map. However, it is unclear whether that map refers to the extant building. The extant building does appear on the 1916 Sanborn as 24 Main Street.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the possible Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
