BUILDING DATE: early 20th century

23 Maple Street is a west-facing, square, symmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay, freestanding, brick residential structure resting on a stone foundation. The design is an American Four-Square, and several similar buildings are located in Smithsburg. The slate, hipped gable roof has hipped dormers in each slope and has deep eaves. An open, flat-roof porch extends across the front of the building. It is supported by Tuscan columns and has a balustrade rail. The entrance, which is located in the north bay, has a multi-pane door flanked by sidelights and a glazed transom. This composition is topped by a heavy stone lintel. Windows are single, double-hung, one-over-one with stone sills and lintels. The rear facade has a two-story porch.

The building appears to be 39 Maple on the 1916 and 1923 Sanborns.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
