



BUILDING DATE: late 19th/early 20th century

16 Maple Street is an east-facing, square, symmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay, freestanding, brick residential structure resting on a stone foundation. The design is an American Four-Square and several similar buildings are located in Smithsburg. The artificial roll, hipped roof has hipped dormers in each slope, deep eaves, and a balustraded widow's walk. An open, hipped-roof porch wraps around the east and north facades of the building. It is supported by Tuscan columns. The entrance is located in the center bay. Windows are single, double-hung, one-over-one (first floor), nine-over-one and fifteen-over-one (second floor) with stone sills. First floor windows have stone lintels, while the second floor windows have jack arches with stone keystones. The rear facade has a two-story porch.

The building appears to be 25 Maple on the 1916 and 1923 Sanborns.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
