DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is improved with a two and one half story, three bay L-shaped brick house. It is constructed with Flemish bonding at the front elevation and common bonding at the side and rear walls. Flat arches of brick are present above the openings. All windows have six over six pane sashes and some have pairs of louvered shutters. The main entrance is centered in the front wall and includes a broad transom and sidelights around an eight panel door flanked with narrow colonnettes. A one bay front porch has hexagonal pillars, two pairs on either side of the entrance. Three dormer windows extend from the south slope of the roof. They are gabled with arch topped windows with small colonnettes on either side. The roof is finished with brick parapets at the gables and double brick chimneys at each end. Also present is a frame bank barn.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This farm is one of three properties northwest of Clear Spring which were owned by the Nesbitt family during the late 18th and first half of the 19th century. This house would appear to have been built during the second quarter of the 19th century. Like the houses on the other two Nesbitt farms, it shows an unusual degree of refinement among Washington County's rural buildings. This house shows the combined influence of the Greek Revival and Federal styles. Further information on the Nesbitt Farms can be found in forms WA-V-014 and WA-V-013.


