DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This large structure, now a sea food restaurant is a two part wood and stone building. One section is a two story, five bay wooden building sheathed with asbestos shingles. It may be of a log or frame construction. The other part of the building is a two story, four bay stone structure, painted white. Entrances were located in its two end bays although one has been enclosed recently. Along the entire front slope of the roof is a series of double gabled dormers. The stone portion of the building would appear to date from the second quarter of the 19th century. The exterior surfaces of the wooden portion are datable to the early 20th century.




