 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmstead includes a brick house, barn, spring house and numerous outbuildings. The house is a two story, five bay structure with a double porch built into a three bay recessed area of the front elevation. The projecting surface of the front wall is laid in Flemish bond while other walls display common bonding.

The main entrance set back in the recess has a broad transom and sidelights around an eight panel door flanked by narrow colonnettes.

Windows have two over two pane sashes which are not original. Part of the double porch appears to have been rebuilt.

East of the house is a large brick end bank barn. Part of its west wall was destroyed in a storm in recent years and was rebuilt with decorative open work ventilators matching others in this wall. Ventilator openings in this barn follow diamond, square and triangular motifs. One course of openings would seem to represent a series of wheat sheafs.
