DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building consists of two one and a half story log houses set at right angles to each other, each one with an exterior end wall stone chimney. The two sections are separated by a breezeway which has been enclosed with vertical board siding. The gables are sheathed with board and batten siding as is the entire east wall of the house. At other surfaces the log walls have been exposed. Corners display "V" notched joining. All windows have two over two pane sashes with plain 20th century architraves. Dormers with overhanging gables have been added to the east, west and south slopes of the roof. The interiors of the two section have been modernized.

The back or northernmost section is reputed to be the older. It has a full basement which includes a fireplace. Its stone chimney stands free from the end wall of the building above the fire box area. Its height has been extended by approximately two feet. The front or south section has no basement and appears to have a later type of chimney. Some distance south of this house off to the west of Mumert Road is a small cemetery for the Forsythe family. Markers date from the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Two of the most significant are hand carved wood.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Forsythe log house has not been dated. The chimney construction of both sections suggests that both parts were built before 1850. The older section presumed to be the north wing and believed locally to date from the late 18th century. The builders were members of the Forsythe family who immigrated to this country from Scotland and pioneered in this mountainous area. The community of Forsythe is located nearby and two mills are said to have operated in the vicinity.


