DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is a two story, five bay structure built of brick, probably dating from the third quarter of the 19th century. A 20th century porch extends across the front elevation. The walls are laid in common bonding except for the first story of the front elevation where all stretcher bond was used. In that area the wall surface was painted red and the mortar joints were struck with white paint. Some six over six pane sashes remain. Two doors are located in the front elevation.


