This brick house is located on the north side of Route 40, east of the town of Conococheague. The house faces south toward the road, and is somewhat overgrown by trees and shrubbery, obscuring some of the building's features. It has a 2½ story main block which faces south toward the road, and a lower ell to the rear. The main block has two brick interior end chimneys, and there is a central chimney in the ell. The main block is three bays wide, with a central doorway. Windows have 2/2 double-hung sash, with brick jack arches above. The west wall of the ell appears to have some ornamental sawn woodwork either on a porch or window. The exterior of the house is largely unaltered.

The Grove house is significant architecturally as a largely unaltered example of possibly a mid-19th century or earlier I-house, and perhaps one of the earliest houses along this section of Route 40. Its brick construction and simple Federal style design are unusual in this vicinity. The house also has a one-story brick ell with central chimney which is also of considerable interest.

The house may possibly be the Grove house shown in about this location on the 1859 Taggart atlas of Washington County, and the U. Grove house shown on the 1877 Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson atlas of the county.





