Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

This brick house is located on the south side of Route 40, west of Walnut Point Road East, between Huyett and Conococheague. It is set close to the road and faces north. The house is composed of a 2½ story, gable roofed main block with an ell of the same height on the south. The main block is three bays wide by one deep; gable end windows are located in the north bay of each end wall. The house has a central doorway on its principal facade, covered by a one bay wide porch with modern metal porch posts.

The windows and door openings on this house are unusual decorative elements for this area. Window openings are segmentally arched and surmounted by brick hood molds; a similar brick hood mold is located over the front door. Windows generally contain 2/2 double-hung sash. A one-story addition, probably later in date, is located to the south of the ell. The property appears to be well maintained and in good condition.



This brick house is architecturally significant for its combination of a basic vernacular I-house form with stylish Italianate window and door trim. Although the overall form of the house is not unusual for this vicinity, the brick hood molds over the windows and front door give the house an unusual appearance. Such elements of the Italianate style are not often seen in this area, but are more common in the nearby city of Hagerstown.

The house is probably one shown on the 1859 Taggart atlas of Washington County as belonging to G. Haner's heirs. On the 1877 Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson atlas it is probably that owned by a Mrs. Haner.
