17 North Mill Street is a west-facing, horizontally massed, one-and-a-half-story with basement, brick and frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is set near the public-right-of-way, has a brick first floor and a frame attic story. The brick, which has been painted white, is laid in a flemish bond. The side-gable roof is sheathed with artificial roll and has one dormer facing the street. There is an arched canopy over the panelled door which is located in the south bay. Windows are double-hung, six-over-six on the first floor and one-over-one in the dormer. An entrance to the basement has been dug out in the front.

The 1877 map of Clear Spring indicates that a building owned by C. Edelen was located on this site. The building is next shown on the 1922 Sanborn where it is numbered 133 Mill.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
