17 North Martin Street is a west-facing, vertically massed, two-story, two-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is set directly at the public-right-of-way, is covered with manufactured siding. The front-gable, artificial roll roof has open eaves. A metal awning supported by iron posts extends across the front facade and has a 1960s model door in the south bay. There are a pair of double-hung, two-over-two sash windows with wide wood frames on each floor in the north bay.

There are no buildings indicated on the east side of North Martin Street on the 1877 map of Clear Spring. The 1922 Sanborn does note three buildings on that side of the street at that time, however, this is not one of them. Its vacant lot is numbered 151 Martin. The style and construction of the building seem to indicate that it was constructed later in the 1920s.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Modern Development Period, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
