Milestone No. 132(136) marks Mason and Dixon's 132nd horizontal mile west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line, later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. It is an original milestone of 1767, quarried and carved in England, of oolitic limestone, ^{now stands about 1 foot above ground.} ~~is in fairly good condition, unaltered,~~ and is the westernmost of those set by Mason and Dixon on this Line. The site was preliminarily surveyed in 1766, milestone set the following year, and reset more securely in 1902 during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. On the national and state levels, it is significant primarily as one of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments in the thematic group series of some 248 markers still defining the West Line. Locally, as one of 48 of these original monuments marking the present Washington/Franklin-Fulton county boundary, it is also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. 132(136) marks Mason and Dixon's 132nd horizontal mile west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line. It is an original milestone of 1767, in fairly good condition, unaltered, and is the westernmost of those set by Mason and Dixon. The site was preliminarily surveyed in 1766, milestone set the following year and reset more securely in 1902 during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary.

The area here is the densely forested eastern slope of Sideling Hill, with only a few houses/^{and small farms} scattered along Rice Road. The site is within Election District 5 of Washington County, MD, and Bethel Township of Fulton County, PA; about 1 mile north of the scattered settlement of Harvey, MD, and US 40; at a point about 1250 feet west of Rice Road/T-301 (Hill Road) at the Line and about 10 feet south of the old Columbia Gas pipeline/^(no longer maintained) at the edge of a deciduous forest. It is unmarked in any way, ~~cannot be seen from any road or from the pipeline,~~ and though protected by its obscurity, is also in danger of vanishing from neglect.

The milestone, as with all original Mason and Dixon monuments along the West Line, is an oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, quarried and carved in England, and originally measured about 12 inches square by about 4 feet or more in length, cut to stand about 3 feet high with the base left rough-cut for setting into the ground. The distinguishing embellishments are the vertical fluting with horizontally-fluted margins on all four sides, and the Roman capital letters P on the north side facing Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, each V-sunk in the center of a plain shallow circle panel near the top. Reset in 1902 to stand presumably about 1½ feet high, it now stands about 1 foot above ground,^{and} measures about 12½ inches on the north and south sides and about 12 inches on the east and west sides. The letters and circle panels are still clear and intact; some fluting and bits of margins remain; the top planes and/^{their} fluting are quite clear,^{though weathered} but there are chips along all edges (with a large chunk out of the top east side) and top corners.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. 132(136) is significant on the national and state levels primarily as one of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments in the thematic group series of some 248 markers still defining their 230.228-mile West Line, the boundary later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. The site was preliminarily surveyed in 1766, and the milestone set the following year--the westernmost actually set by Mason and Dixon along the West Line. It was reset more securely in 1902 during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Locally, as one of 48 original monuments marking the present Washington/Franklin-Fulton county boundary (10 crownstones; 38 milestones), No. 132(136) is also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.


