Milestone No. ---(138) marks / useful survey point on Mason and Dixon's West Line
between ^{the remains of} two original mounds: No. ---(137) on Sideling Hill ^{about 1/2 mile} ridge to the east and
No. --- (140) about 1 1/4 miles to the west. It is an original milestone of 1767,
brought from the vicinity of Clear Spring, Maryland, ^{and first set at an additional site} in 1902 during the 1900-03
Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. It is an embellished oolitic
limestone post with a low pyramidal top, quarried and carved in England, firmly
in place, ^{measuring about 12 inches square} in excellent condition, unaltered, and standing about 1 1/2 feet
above ground. Its distinguishing decorative features remain essentially intact
and clear, though weathered: vertical fluting with horizontally-fluted margins
on all four sides and the Roman capital letters P on the north side facing
Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, each V-sunk in the center
of a plain shallow circle panel near the top. This milestone is significant on
the national and state levels primarily as one of 135 original Mason and Dixon
/ monuments in the thematic group series of some ²⁴⁸ markers still defining the West Line. Locally, as one of 48 of these original
monuments marking the present Washington/Franklin-Fulton county boundary, it is
also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with
a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of
these counties.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

an irregular interval but useful survey
 Milestone No. ---(138) marks /point on Mason and Dixon's West Line about midway between the preceding crownstone and stone mound on the ridge of Sideling Hill and Bear Creek at the western bottom of the mountain. It is an original about a half mile to the east brought from the vicinity of Clear Spring, MD, and first milestone of 1767/set at this additional site in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. It is in excellent condition, unaltered, and stands ^{firmly} about 18 inches high, presumably as set.

The area here ^{is rural,} rather open, mountain foothills, partially wooded, partially farmed, sparsely settled. The site is within Election District 5 of Washington County, MD, and Union Township of Fulton County, PA; on the west slope of Sideling Hill; ^{about 1 1/2 miles north-northeast of the scattered settlement of Forest Park, MD;} at a point about 1300 feet west of Mountain Road/T-308 and about 6 feet south of the narrow east-west private lane serving the farm at the ^{west} end of the lane. It is in the lane's shoulder/berm, about 2 feet north of the old east-west barbed wire fence along the north side of the James Hendershort property. It can be seen ^{easily} from the lane, all seasons, but is protected by being above the lane grade level and in a scraggly hedgerow fringe.

The milestone, as with all original Mason and Dixon West Line monuments, is an oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, quarried and carved in England, originally measuring about 12 inches square by about 4 feet or more long, cut to stand about 3 feet high with the base left rough-cut for setting into the ground. The distinguishing embellishments are the vertical fluting with horizontally-fluted margins on all four sides, and the Roman capital letters P on the north side facing Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, each V-sunk in the center of a plain shallow circle panel near the top. It is firmly in place, ^{continues to} measure about 12 inches square; both letters and circle panels are clear and intact, though weathered; most fluting and margins remain, as do the planes, fluting and apex of the top. ^{and mottled with a liberal sprinkling of lichen} All surfaces are slightly weathered; all edges and the top corners have minor chips; ^{and} there is a bullet-hole pit on the east side.

Milestone No. ---(138) is significant on the national and state levels primarily as one of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments in the thematic group series of some 248 markers still defining their 230.228-mile West Line, the boundary later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. ^{area of the} The/site was preliminarily surveyed in 1766, but not monumented until 1902 when an original milestone of 1767 was brought from the vicinity of Clear Spring, MD, ^{and first set} during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Locally, as one of 48 original monuments marking the present Washington/Franklin-Fulton county boundary (10 crownstones; 38 milestones), No. ---(138) is also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.


