DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This structure is a three bay town residence which adjoins 126-128 Conococheague Street, to the south. It is of frame construction with a central entrance and is covered with asbestos shingle siding. Windows are spaced irregularly and have two over two pane double hung sashes. Architraves have pedimented top pieces. At the entrance is a small hipped roof porch. Although 124 Conococheague Street is attached to its neighbor to the south and has received the same exterior surface treatment, it would appear to have been constructed at a different time since windows are of a smaller size and are at a higher level. The house would appear to date from the late 19th century.
