DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This brick combination commercial and residential structure is a seven bay, two story brick structure, facing east on the southwest corner of South Conococheague and West Salisbury Streets. Its entire surface has been painted red. Windows have two over two pane double hung sashes beneath flat arches of brick. Entrances are located in the second and fourth bays from the south end. The three north bays at the first story are occupied by a turn of the century period store front which remains with relatively few alterations. Chimneys are located inside the end walls and a third chimney rises from the interior of the building between the second and third bays from the south end. A one story two bay brick shed roofed extension with a diamond shaped brick ventilation opening is attached to the south end wall. The building would appear to date from the third quarter of the 19th century.
