DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is a two story, five bay brick structure painted green. It stands on the west side of North Conococheague Street and faces east. It appears to date from the second quarter of the 19th century with late 19th century renovations. The walls are laid in Flemish bond at the front elevation. The end walls rise above the edge of the roof and are capped with a corbel, forming a parapet.

Windows have two over two pane sashes and date from the late 19th century. Their heads are segmentally arched. There are also pairs of louvered shutters with arched tops to fit the contour of the windows.

The main entrance is centrally placed in the front elevation. The door is hung beneath a semi-circular fanlight within a brick arch.

The roof is covered with standing seam sheet metal. Double brick chimneys are located inside the gable ends. At the eaves are a series of Victorian period brackets.


