DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house, located on the west side of North Vermont Street is a two story, three bay brick structure, probably dating from the early 19th century. Its walls display Flemish bonding at the front elevation. Windows have modern single pane sashes held within moderately wide frames and beneath flat arches of brick. The main entrance is located in the north bay of the front elevation and includes a late 19th century transom. The roofing material is standing seam sheet metal. Double inside end brick chimneys are located at the south end.


