According to available information, the H. Hearn House, located outside Salisbury, Maryland, does not meet any of the National Register Criteria for listing. The frame, three bay by one bay I-House with cross gable was probably constructed c. 1876 and is similar to numerous modest 19th and early 20th century houses found throughout the state, but especially on the Eastern Shore, in rural areas and small towns. Thus this house does not have any particular architectural significance. This house is not associated with any known significant event or person, nor is located in any known historic district.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The H. Hearn House is a two story, three bay frame house with interior end chimneys and a center bay entry porch and central gable breaking the eaves on the front elevation. It dates from approximately 1876.

The exterior is covered in modern asbestos siding and the roofs of both the main block and the porch are of modern composition material. A small pointed gable window in the front elevation has 6 panes, while the rest of the fenestration is 2/2. The entry has side-lights and transom and the door has applied, arched moldings.

A rear ell extension may be of later construction than the main block. Several large trees are clustered about the house and several modern outbuildings. Shrubbery conceals the foundation at the front and sides of the main block. A driveway encircles the house and connects the site with U.S. 50. An avenue of trees may have formerly flanked the drive; however, few remain.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house represents the settlement pattern of farms in the 19th century along the main road from Cambridge to Salisbury (U.S. 50). The small pointed gable window, a fairly common detail in Maryland houses in the late 19th century, is an example of Gothic "survival", typifying a vernacular use of a decorative element of a style long since considered old fashioned in more sophisticated architecture.


