With its prominent location the late nineteenth century Victorian dwelling is an important visual architectural anchor for the district. Dating to around 1880-90, the asymmetrical tee-shaped design features decorative sawnwork and fishscale shingles. Stretching across the front of the house is a tapered pier porch that includes a porte cochere at the north end. The house stands next to St. Philips Episcopal Church and for many years has been used as the rectory.

The St. Philips Episcopal Church rectory, also known as the Annie Roberts house, is located at 6453 Quantico Road (Main Street) in the village of Quantico, Wicomico County, Maryland. The two-story, tee-shaped frame house is located on the east side of the street with the principal elevation facing west. The house is oriented on a north/south axis.

Erected around 1880-90, this two-story, tee-shaped frame dwelling is supported by a continuous common bond brick foundation, and the house is sheathed with a layer of aluminum siding. The steeply pitched roof is clad with asphalt shingles. Standing behind the house are two small frame outbuildings.

The west (main) elevation of the house is an asymmetrical facade with a center entrance sheltered by a shed roof porch that fills the inside corner of the tee-plan. The four-panel front door is framed by three-light sidelights and a three-light transom. The two-over-two sash windows are flanked by louvered shutters. Supporting the shed roof porch are tapered, paneled piers. The porch extends to the north to include a porte cochere. The projecting leg of the tee-plan is a three-sided bay topped by a gable roof trimmed with decorative soffit brackets. Fixed in the gable end is a pointed arch window surrounded by a field of fishscale shingles. The eaves to the roof are extended with decorated rafter ends exposed.

The north gable is a single bay deep with a single two-over-two sash windows the first and second floors. A pointed arch window pierces the upper gable end to light the attic.

The south side of the house is defined by an asymmetrical placement of two-over-two sash windows. A small shed roofed pent eave extends over paired window sash on the southeast corner.

The interior was not seen.

With its important location and relatively intact exterior, this house is classified under Category B, which identifies properties that should be preserved since it contains a structure exhibiting some good architectural details representing a good example of architectural development and style, and at the same time supports the character of the district.


