The Dorman bungalow is a small rectangular frame house built in 1947-48 by brothers Roland and Melvin Dorman. Started in November 1947, Roland and his wife Mary moved into the house in May 1948. She still resides in the five-room dwelling, located on the north side of Cherry Walk Road. Although a relatively plain structure, the rectangular frame house has a gable-front facade and a hip roofed front porch. Characteristic of the style are the exposed rafter feet.

The Mary Dorman house is a single-story gable-front frame bungalow that stands on the north side of Cherry Walk Road in the northern section of Quantico, Wicomico County, Maryland. The single-story frame dwelling faces south with the gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built in 1947-48, this single-story rectangular frame house is supported by a concrete block foundation, and it is sheathed with plain weatherboard siding. The medium pitched roof with exposed rafter feet is covered with asphalt shingles. Rising through the center of the house is a brick stove chimney.

The south side is a three-bay elevation with a center entrance and flanking three-over-one sash windows. The three openings are sheltered by a hip roofed porch.

The east and west sides are essentially alike with three window openings filled with three-over-one sash windows. Flanking the window openings are board and batten shutters.

The interior was not seen.
