The construction of the Huffington-Malone is documented by a mortgage executed on June 22, 1878 for \$120, which calls for a one-year term of payment with interest. Also included in the language of the transaction is the phrase, "all that house and lot situated in the village of Upper Trappe in said Wicomico County, lately built by these grantors." The grantors, Phillip and Martha Messick, sold the property to Caroline E. Huffington. Wheelwright John Huffington, aged 41, and Caroline Huffington, aged 27, are listed in the 1880 United States census with their son James Walter, 3, and a daughter, Maude V., aged 1. The Huffingtons continued to reside in the house through the balance of the nineteenth century and into the early twentieth century. On the last day of December 1913 Caroline Huffington sold their house to Beatrice Jones Malone for \$1,000. Beatrice Jones Malone and her husband, W. Twilley Malone resided here when the 1920 census was taken. W. Twilley Malone is listed as a 35-year old architect with his wife, Beatrice, aged 34, and three sons, James T., Frank, and Roscoe. After Beatrice's death, Twilley Malone married Mary Lankford, in whose hands the property remained until the early 1970s. Twilley Malone was born in a family of house builders and woodworkers and his mastery of architectural design for the period is clearly evident in many buildings remaining in the Salisbury area.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Huffington-Malone house stands at 3369 Allen Road in the center of Allen, Wicomico County, Maryland. The two-story, two-bay frame house faces west with the gable roof oriented on an east/west axis.

Documented to date to 1877-78, this two-story, two-bay by two-bay rectangular frame house is supported on a low brick foundation, and the exterior is clad with vinyl siding. The steeply pitched gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the back of the double-pile main block is a modern single-story service wing. A story-and-a-half outbuilding stands in the back yard.

The west (main) facade is two bays across with modern nine-over-nine replacement sash windows, while the second floor is defined by a pair of six-over-six replacement windows. Paneled pilasters trim the corners of the house, and each panel is topped by a round arch. The gable end is finished with an extended eave with returns at the base. The cornice is trimmed with bed and crown moldings.

The south side contains the principal entrance, which is located in the southwest corner. The door is a modern replacement. Located directly adjacent to the doorway is a single story bay window filled with replacement sash windows. The second floor is lighted by a pair of replacement windows as well as a small octagonal window that marks the wall area between the window openings. A narrow brick chimney stack pierces the center of the roof.

The north wall is defined by a replacement nine-over-nine sash window that fills the right (west) bay and a shed roofed bay window that projects from the left (east) bay. The rectangular three-sided bay window is filled with replacement sash windows as well. The rear corners of the main block are trimmed with paneled pilasters like the front of the house.

The east (rear) wall is partially covered by the single-story kitchen and service wing. Replacement windows mark the second floor.

The interior was not seen.

Standing in the backyard is a story-and-a-half, gable-roofed frame outbuilding sheathed with weatherboard siding.


