The Tyaskin Methodist Episcopal Church, a tee-shaped Gothic Revival structure located on a well-shaded lot in this river-front community, was built in 1894-95. The asymmetrically designed frame church is dominated by an entrance and bell tower that rises on the southwest corner and is capped by a tall, octagonal broach spire. The sides of the belfry feature large brackets. One of the more interesting and unusual design features for the Tyaskin church is the front entrance. The steeply pitched gable roof of the church is extended on this west side to shelter the Gothic arched front entrance. Fixed in the base of the foundation next to the entrance is the marble datestone documenting construction in 1894.

The land on which the church and cemetery are located was acquired officially on March 8, 1894 when B. R. Dashiell sold a ½ acre lot to the church trustees, Esau D. Insley, Franklin B. Culver, Albert H. Riall, R. W. J. Larmore and James K. Covington.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Tyaskin Methodist Episcopal Church, now known as the Tyaskin United Methodist Church, stands at 21424 Tyaskin Church Road in the community of Tyaskin, Wicomico County, Maryland. The church faces south with the principal gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built in 1894, the single-story, tee-shaped frame building is supported by an infilled brick pier foundation, and the exterior is clad with a combination of aluminum and vinyl siding. The steeply pitched gable roofs are covered with asphalt shingles. Surrounding the church on three sides is a nineteenth and twentieth century cemetery.

The south (main) elevation is an asymmetrical facade with a corner entrance and bell tower flanked by a gable-front elevation. The double door entrance that pierces the tower is topped by a pointed arch colored glass transom and an extension of the adjacent gable roof shelters the front door. Above the first story height the tower slopes inward with a mid-level roof, which forms the base of the bell tower. An open belfry is decorative with corner brackets. Rising above the belfry is an octagonal broach spire, which is topped by a metal weathervane in the shape of an arrow. The adjacent gable front elevation is pierced by a pair of narrow, pointed arch, colored glass lancet windows. Piercing the upper gable end is a round window with muntins that follow the form of a cloverleaf. The panes are colored glass. The edge to the roof is finished with extended eaves. Fixed in the brick foundation of the front wall is a marble datestone inscribed, "Tyaskin M. E. Church, 1894."

The south wall is marked by a series of four pointed arch, colored glass windows. Rising through the south slope of the roof is a stuccoed brick stove chimney. The north wall, on the other hand, is marked by two pointed arch windows.

The east (rear) wall is extended by a single story apse supported on concrete blocks. Fixed in the upper gable end is a round window with the same cloverleaf muntin design that is found in the front window.

The interior was not seen.


