Situated on a small rise of land along Wetipquin Road, this single-story, gable-front frame church houses the Freedman's Methodist congregation. Originally supported on brick piers, the rectangular frame church features pointed arch windows on each side elevation. The church is surrounded on three sides by a nineteenth and twentieth century cemetery. Freedman's Methodist is one of a handful of active African-American churches in the vicinity of Tyaskin.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Freeman's Methodist Church is located near the intersection of Wetipquin and Deep Branch Road with the modern address of 21854 Wetipquin Road, which is near the village of Tyaskin, Wicomico County, Maryland. The single-story, rectangular frame church faces east with the gable roof oriented on an east/west axis.

Estimated to date to the early twentieth century, the single-story gable-front frame church is supported by an infilled brick pier foundation, and the exterior is clad with a uniform layer of asbestos shingles. The medium pitched gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the northeast corner of the church is a mid twentieth century concrete block addition. Surrounding the church on three sides is a cemetery.

The east (main) elevation is a three-bay facade with double front doors piercing a single story gable roofed entrance vestibule. The double front doors are replacements, and a Gothic arched transom has been filled with modern colored glass. Located to each side of the entry are pointed arch, single pane sash windows. The edge to the gable end is finished with an extended eave with returns at the base of the roof.

The south side of the church is defined by three pointed arch colored glass windows. The base to the roof is finished with a boxed cornice. Rising through the side of the church is a single flue brick stove chimney.

The rear wall features a single story gable roofed apse, which is extended on each side by a shed roof addition. There are no windows in the gable end.

The north side is partially covered by the mid twentieth century concrete block addition. Two bays are marked by Gothic arched, colored glass windows. An interior side brick stove chimney pierces the roofline.

The interior was not seen.

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
