Built on the south bank of the Wetipquin Creek, the site of the Marcellus J. Larmore house overlooks the mouth of the creek where it joins the Nanticoke River. Estimated to date to the 1870s or 1880s, the two-story, four-bay frame house retains a turned post porch that stretches across the west front as well as continuing around the north gable end facing the creek.

The two-story frame house was probably erected by John A. and Clara V. Insley, who sold a four-acre parcel with improvements to Edwin L. Mudgett in October 1887. Transferred for \$500, the house was probably standing at the time. Six years later, Edwin Mudgett, then identified as a resident of Johnstown, Pennsylvania, sold the four-acre lot and dwelling to Marcellus J. Larmore for \$600. The property remained in Larmore family hands for the balance of the nineteenth century and well into the twentieth. It was not sold out of the family until 1961.

The Marcellus J. Larmore house stands at 21302 Tyaskin Wharf Road on the northern edge of the community of Tyaskin, Wicomico County, Maryland. The two-story, four-bay frame house faces west with the gable oriented on a north/south axis.

Built around 1870-1880, the two-story, four-bay main block is supported on an infilled brick pier foundation, and the exterior is clad with asbestos shingles. The steeply pitched roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the south gable end of the main block is a story-and-a-half, one-room plan wing. Extending from the east side of the main block is another single story wing.

The west (main) elevation is a four-bay facade sheltered on the first floor by a turned post porch embellished with sawn corner brackets. The porch extends across the front of the south end wing as well as around the north gable end of the main house. The porch shelters the front door as well as two-over-two sash windows that light the first floor. The second floor of the main house is lighted by four evenly spaced two-over-two sash windows. An internal brick stove stack rises through the center of the house.

The south gable end of the main block is largely covered by the story-and-a-half two-bay wing that is pierced by a west side by a front door. The wing is lighted by two-over-two sash windows. A single two-over-two sash window marks the gable end, which is finished with an extended eave.

The east side of the main block is partially covered by the single story gable roofed rear wing, which shares the many of the same features as the rest of the house. Two-over-two sash windows mark each elevation.

The interior was not seen.




