Located at 8000 Quantico Road, Hebron, Westside Intermediate School opened in 1931 for grades 1-11. Designed by Francis H. Dryden, the school consisted of 8 classrooms, auditorium, and library. This original building has undergone significant modification with two large 1960s additions, window replacement and 1960s alteration to the main entrance. In my opinion, these alterations reduce the architectural and historical integrity of the school and therefore I have determined it not eligible for the Maryland Register.

Hebron School at 8000 Quantico Road in Hebron, Wicomico County, Maryland is not located in an historic district nor is it considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Hebron School, now known as the Westside Intermediate School, is located at the intersection of Railroad Road and MD 347. The property was originally part of the National Register-listed St Giles Plantation (WI-30), but is not included within the Register boundaries. The school was built in 1931 as the Hebron School for grades one through seven. In 1955, the school became an elementary school (Grades 1-6) serving white students from the Hebron and Mardela communities. In 1963-64, Hebron School was integrated.

The building itself includes the original structure and later additions. The original building is a red brick structure covered with a hipped roof; subsequent alterations which encapsulate the original building obscure any stylistic detailing. The original building housed eight classrooms, principal's office, book room library and multi-purpose room with a stage. In the late 1930s, a cafeteria was added; in 1966 a new wing was added to the southeast side of the building. A gymnasium and portable classrooms stand as separate structures at the rear of the building.

The Hebron School does not retain sufficient architectural integrity to qualify for listing on the National Register under Criterion C. The original building has been significantly altered by subsequent additions, leaving little of the original structure visible. Although the school is representative of a segregated school, later to be integrated, the property otherwise is not known to have associations with events or persons significant to our past and thus does not qualify for listing under Criteria A or B.

Description

The Hebron School, now known as the Westside Intermediate School, fronts on MD 347 at the corner of Railroad Road on property formerly part of the St. Giles plantation (WI-30). The original Hebron School Building, built in 1931 and the main portion of the present school, is a one story rectangular red brick structure, five-bays wide and four-bays deep. A low hipped roof rises from the central area above the multipurpose room and is adorned with detailed cornice, surrounded by flat roofs around the perimeter of the building. The simple common bond of red brick is bonded in contrasting natural mortar. A belt course runs along the northern and southern elevations above the fenestration. The facade is symmetrical with a central entrance accentuated with one row of a horizontal soldier course mitered into a vertical soldiers course framed by a single rowlock course. The windows are bays of six vertical industrial-type windows of five horizontal lights, with the top pane larger than the four sequential panes, reminiscent of the earlier craftsman movement and pre-industrial sash.

The building opened in the spring of 1931 as the Hebron School for grades one through eleven. The structure housed eight classrooms, principal's office, book room library and a multipurpose room with a stage. A cafeteria was added in the late thirties with a then modern kitchen. A new wing was added to the southeast side to the building in 1966. A gymnasium and portable classrooms are separate structures located to the rear of the original structure.


In 1956 a second school, Westside Primary, was built on the school property to the rear of the Westside Intermediate School building. The school is a one story red brick structure and was built to compliment the original Hebron school building.

Significance


The original Hebron School building is a modest brick vernacular structure reflecting elements of the neoclassical style which was dominant throughout the country during the first half of the twentieth century. While this school has minor historical significance because of its evolution in part under the influence of integration in schooling during the early 1960's in a rural community of the lower Eastern Shore of Maryland, the architectural importance of the building has been diminished as originally designed, compounded by the addition of rooms, a wing and a second school, increasing the building density on the site. These new structures and additions have intruded upon the original building, obviating the original relationship between the bulk of the structures relative to the open land.

The building was built in 1931 as the Hebron School for grades one through eleven. The south side served the elementary grades and the north side served the high school grades. Twelfth grade was added in the mid-forties. The last class graduated from the Hebron High School in 1955, at which time the Hebron School became an elementary school (grades one through six) serving white students from the Hebron and Mardela communities. In 1963-64 the Hebron School was integrated to serve both black and white students in grades 1-6. Prior to then, the Nanticoke School built in 1914, served the black and white community until 1967, at which time the school closed. The Wenaquah School, named after the communities of Wetipquin, Nanticoke and Quantico, built in 1956, became the Westside Primary and the Hebron School was re-named the Westside Intermediate School. The resultant Westside Schools, paired as they are today, were once two separate schools serving two different communities.


