Mr. J. Allen McAllister, the present owner, indicated that he did not believe this building was ever owned by the Perdues.

It is a 2-story, 2-part frame structure covered with clapboard. The taller part is 3 bays long with side door having a transom above. Several of the clapboards are falling off and several lights are broken out of the sash. The other portion of the building is 4 bays long. It too is two stories, though the windows on the second story are nearly on the floor and only two panes high. A large brick chimney pierces the A roof about in the center of the wing. To the rear of the wing is a leanto porch with a brick floor.

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
