The neoclassical front of the Bank of Delmar, dating to the early twentieth century, features a symmetrical rhythm of four brick pilasters accented with limestone bases and capitals. Centered within the three-bay facade is a round arched entrance framed with a stone surround enriched with carved moldings. The round arched transom includes "Est. 1896" within the leaded glass pattern. During the mid to late twentieth century the early twentieth-century bank was encapsulated by later brick additions.

Despite the later modifications that have surrounded this early twentieth-century bank, the neoclassical facade has a distinctive presence on Delmar's main business street, and it is one of the few historic commercial buildings surviving on the Maryland side of the town.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Bank of Delmar is located at 12 East State Street in the center of Delmar, Wicomico County, Maryland. The bank building faces north.

Built around 1920, the single-story brick bank building is supported on polished granite base, and it is surrounded, above as well as to each side, by mid to late twentieth century brick additions. The historic three-bay front is laid in stretcher bond, and the three-bay wall is defined by four brick pilasters featuring stone capitals and bases.

The center bay is filled with a round arched door opening framed in a neoclassical surround and arched transom. The door surround features carved consoles that visually support the molded entablature. Fixed atop the entablature is the arched transom defined by a molded stone surround fitted with a center keystone. A leaded glass transom includes "Est. 1896" within the colored glass design. The front door is a modern glass replacement.

Located to each side are large sized window openings filled with eight-over-eight sash windows topped by four-light transoms. Each window opening features a stone still and a stone jack arch. The jack arches have articulated keystones and end blocks. Below each window is an inset brick panel. Stretching across the top of the first story is a stone entablature which is inscribed, "The Bank of Delmar." The former parapet wall rises atop the entablature and is accented by a stone cap. The stretcher bond brick walls rise atop the early twentieth century bank building.

The interior has been remodeled.


