John A. and Hannah M. Kuhn hired Salisbury contractor J. Woolford Johnson to design and build this substantial two-story Colonial Revival frame dwelling on a lot they purchased in July 1928. While J. Woolford Johnson was the general contractor, house carpenter Marvin Beale implemented the project and executed the finely detailed Colonial Revival design. The center hall plan dwelling boasts a neoclassical front portico and a dentiled cornice that wraps around the perimeter of the roof. Large triangular pediments distinguish the gable ends, which are pierced by quarter round attic windows on the south side and a Palladian window on the north. Single-story enclosed porches accented with neoclassical balustrades extend from each gable end. The house is also distinguished by a series of louvered and paneled shutters pierced with a candlestick motif. Construction took approximately a year with completion in September 1929.

John A. Kuhn moved to Salisbury in 1923 with a plan to acquire the Fisher Jewelry store, a long-time fixture in the central business district. (See WI-147)

The John A. Kuhn house is located at 900 Camden Avenue in the southern residential district known as Camden in Salisbury, Wicomico County, Maryland. The two-story, five-bay Colonial Revival frame house faces east with the gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built around 1928, the two-story, five-bay, center hall brick house is supported on a low brick foundation and the exterior is clad with painted wood shingles. The main block is covered by a medium sloped asphalt shingle roof. Located off the southwest corner of the house is a contemporaneous single-story frame garage.

The east (main) facade is a symmetrical five-bay elevation with a center entrance and flanking windows. The long multi-pane windows are flanked by louvered shutters. The raised-panel front door is framed by sidelights, and the entire bay is sheltered by a neoclassical portico with fluted square columns rising to a classical entablature. The flat roof is trimmed with a square post balustrade. The second floor is lighted by six-over-six sash windows flanked by shutters that are partially paneled and partially louvered. Candlestick cut-outs distinguish the raised panel of each shutter. The base of the roof is trimmed with a Colonial Revival cornice.

The south gable end of the main block is covered on the first floor by an enclosed single-story porch fitted with a square post rooftop balustrade. Rising in the center of the gable end is an exterior/interior brick chimney that pierces the pediment gable end. Six-over-six sash windows light the second floor, and each opening is flanked by louvered shutters. The gable end is marked by quarter round windows fitted with radiating muntins.

The north gable end includes a single-story enclosed porch that also features a square post balustrade. The second floor is lighted by six-over-six sash windows, and the pediment end is distinguished by a Palladian window.

Attached to the west (rear) wall is a two-story service wing.


