Jerusalem Methodist Church

One of the landmarks in the town of Parsonsborg is the Jerusalem Methodist Church, perched atop a sandy knoll in the center of town. Organized in 1839, the congregation erected a single-story, gable-front frame church in 1875. The weatherboard frame structure, designed with a pediment front like many lower Shore churches, was embellished with a series of decorative brackets that trim the perimeter of the roof and rear apse. The original temple-front structure has been modified over the years with the introduction of memorial colored glass windows, a corner entrance tower as well as a raised concrete block foundation with full basement. The church cemetery, located on the south side of the church, contains many nineteenth- and twentieth-century markers. Several family plots are distinguished by decorative metal fences.

The land on which the church stands was conveyed by George Perdue in 1840. The church lot was transferred to the trustees at the time; Henry Mills, Levin Hayman, William W. Layfield, George K. Perdue, Elijah L. Perdue, George W. Riggin, and Isaac H. Parsons.

Jerusalem Methodist Church is located on the southeast corner of the intersection of MD Route 346 (Old Ocean City Road) and Forest Grove Road in Parsonsburg, Wicomico County, Maryland. The single-story frame church, perched atop a sandy knoll is joined on the lot by a nineteenth- and twentieth-century cemetery. The church faces east with the principal gable roof oriented on an east/west axis.

Built in 1875, the single-story gable front frame building is supported on a raised concrete block foundation, and the exterior is clad with aluminum siding. The medium pitched gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the northwest corner of the 1875 structure is an entrance tower, which was erected in 1889. The church rests on a fully high foundation with a fully excavated basement that was added in 1956. A marble stone, fixed in the foundation, documents the 1875 and 1956 construction dates as well as the founding of the congregation in 1839.

Attached to the northwest corner of the 1875 church is the entrance tower which is defined by an arched double door entrance sheltered by a Colonial Revival portico. The double doors are topped by an arched transom filled with radiating muntins. Above the entrance is a four-pane window. The tower is accented with a bracketed eave, and a pyramidal roofed tower. Louvered vents and a small block cornice define the sides of the tower. The gable end of the 1875 building is pierced by a large round arched window filled with leaded colored glass. Trimming the gable end pediment is series of heavy cornice brackets. The gable end pediment is pierced by a round window also filled with colored glass.

The sides of the church are marked by three pointed arch, colored glass windows. A concrete walk and cellar entrance are located on the south side of the church. The main block is served by an interior brick stove chimney.

Attached to the back of the main block is a shorter single story apse finished with a pediment end and a bracketed eave.

The nineteenth- and twentieth-century cemetery is distinguished by several decorative iron fences. One of the oldest markers is the grave for Isaac H. Parsons (1819-1899) and his wife Katie, founding members of the congregation.




