Defining the corner of Parsons and Gay streets in the Newtown Historic District is a late Victorian story-and-a-half frame house distinctive for its steeply pitched roofs and asymmetrically designed gables and dormers. Estimated to date around 1900, the three-bay dwelling was evidently moved to this location between 1916 and 1923 according to successive Sanborn Insurance maps. The 1916 map indicates the corner lot was unimproved, but seven years later the outline of this house is clearly defined. The architectural form and several features, such as the turned post porch enhanced with sawn corner brackets, are common to late nineteenth-century dwellings. The house is joined on the corner lot by a single-story hip roofed garage.

For nearly thirty years, beginning in 1926, the house and lot were held by the Division Street Baptist church, whose trustees acquired the property from Lucretia B. Ruark, who only served as a short-term title holder who is recorded as the grantee in a transfer recorded three days earlier from Lydia Grier Phillips and her husband H. Lay Phillips. The house was probably moved by the Phillips or the prior owner, E. Riall White.

The Baptist Church parsonage stands at 312 Gay Street on the northwest corner of the intersection of Gay and Parson's Street in the Newtown Historic District of Salisbury, Wicomico County, Maryland. The story-and-a-half frame house faces east with the principal gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built around 1900 and evidently moved to this location, the story-and-a-half, three-bay, single-pile frame house is supported on a raised foundation of early twentieth-century fired brick, and the exterior is clad uniformly with vinyl siding. The steeply pitched roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Joining the house on the lot is a single-story early twentieth-century frame garage.

The east (main) elevation is an asymmetrical three-bay façade with a center entrance and flanking two-over-two replacement windows. The entrance is defined by half leaf five-panel doors topped by a single-pane transom. Sheltering the first floor is a hip roofed porch supported by turned posts and enhanced with sawn corner brackets with drops in the center of the bays to each side of a cross gable fixed atop the porch roof. The steeply pitched main roof features a large steeply pitched cross gable roof above the south bay, whereas the other two bays are marked by smaller gable roofed dormers. The cross gable and dormers are fitted with replacement two-over-two sash windows.

The south side of the house is defined by an exterior stretcher bond brick chimney stack that has corbelled shoulders, and to each side of the stack are replacement two-over-two sash windows. Three pane windows light the cellar. The edge of the roof is finished with an extended eave and closed soffitt.

The north gable end, on the other hand, is pierced by a pair of two-over-two replacement sash windows on the first floor, and a single two-over-two sash window on the second floor.

The rear (west) elevation of the main block is largely covered by a two-story, two-bay by two-bay, gable roofed service wing. Located on the south wall is a side entrance fitted with a replacement door, which is flanked by two-over-two sash windows. An exterior brick stove stack rises against the west gable end, which is also pierced by two-over-two sash windows.

The interior has been modified to accommodate multiple apartments. Standing on the north side of the house is a single-story, hip roofed frame garage.




Sanborn Insurance Map, 1916


