H.J. Langsdale, grist mill on Rewastico Creek downstream of T. Bennett sawmill, 215 acres, born in Somerset County; settled in Wicomico, 1835; atlas patron. [1877 Lake, Griffing, & Stevenson Atlas] Same as Rewastico Mill. A clapboard mill with no paint left; perched over spillway; now a storage building. Rewastico Mill Pond. On present Athel-Quantico Road just SW of the terminus of Porters Mill Road. Wheel dismantled.


## Rewastico Mill


