It is three bays long, one room deep and only one story with attic high. It is built of frame on brick piers and is covered with cypress siding. To the rear is a hyphen and kitchen, set at right angles to the main house.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Within, the building is divided into two front rooms, one having a large mantel of crude proportions on a wall of vertical beaded boards. The stairs to the loft are enclosed behind this wall. The other room is very small and has a very small fireplace with mantel. The other two rooms have nothing to distinguish them.</p>
