One of the best known landmarks of Snow Hill was the three-story Purnell Hotel, formerly located on the corner of Washington and Green streets in the hearth of the commercial district. Built within the few years following the August 1893 fire, the hotel occupied the same site as the old Washington House, a late eighteenth or early nineteenth century tavern destroyed in the blaze. The new three-story brick hotel with its rounded front corner and and decorative iron porches became a focal point in the town's social and commercial life. It was designed by architect, Jackson C. Gott of Baltimore. An advertisement for contractors was printed in the Democratic Messenger on August 25, 1894. The ad read,

The undersigned invites sealed proposals for contractors to build a three story and attic brick hotel on the corner of Washington and Green streets in Snow Hill according to plans, specifications and details made by Jackson C. Gott, architect, which can be seen upon application at the Democratic Messenger office. The bids will be opened Tuesday, September ....., 1894 and contract awarded. The right to reject all bids reserved. Building to be completed Feb. 1st, 1895. Thomas M. Purnell, Snow Hill, Md.

The hotel stood on the prominent downtown corner until the 1960s when it was razed and replaced by a single story pharmacy building.

The old Purnell Hotel, torn down during the mid 1960s, stood on the southwest corner of the intersection of North Washington and Green streets in the heart of Snow Hill, Worcester County, Maryland. The principal entrance faced northeast and Washington Street.

Built around 1900, the three-story brick building was a flat roofed structure with uneven facades of five or six bays and a rounded northeast corner. Encircling the first floor was a metal awning supported by iron posts, and the Washington Street elevation included a second floor porch. Lighting the three floors was a combination of two-over-two and six-over-two sash windows fitted with rusticated stone sills and segmental brick jack arches. The principal entrance was located on the northeast side where partially glazed double doors were framed by sidelights and a transom. A secondary entrance north of the main door was marked by a glazed door and transom. Three additional entrances opened off of Green Street. Flanking most of the windows were pairs of louvered shutters, and finishing the top of the parapet wall was a molded metal cornice with end blocks topped by small finials. Narrow brick stove stacks protruded through the flat roof.

Formerly located in the center of the Snow Hill business district, the old Purnell Hotel was one of the focal points of social and commercial activity for this small Worcester County seat. The three-story brick structure, erected during the rebuilding of the town after the 1893 fire, presented six-bay elevations on Washington and Green streets. Similar to many surviving commercial buildings was the metal cornice that trimmed the top of the parapet wall. Unusual to the structure was the rounded front corner and the two-story iron porch that marked the Washington Street side. After the building was torn down in the mid 1960s a single-story, flat-roofed drugstore was erected in its place.



