<p>In the small village of St. Martin is a mid-nineteenth century general store formerly operated by the Gillis family. It is a two-story rectangular structure with a leanto on one side. There is also a wide eave which has brackets along the cornice, similar to work on Italianate-style buildings. It is a rare survivor of mid-nineteenth century commerce.</p>
