On June 25, 1856, Peter Whaley and his wife Elizabeth Davis Whaley transferred to the trustees of the newly formed "Eden Presbyterian Church of Whaley Ville" a small tract of land known as "Grays Lot." Located on the road leading east from the main intersection of the village, the lot was improved shortly afterwards with a Greek Revival style frame church.

One of a small collection of Greek Revival style rural churches in Worcester County, the 1856 building is oriented to face north with a pedimented front elevation. Despite a sheathing of asbestos shingles and the removal of the corner pilasters, the church retains a significant degree of integrity with its classically inspired entrance and pediment. Important additional features include the fluted surround that trims the upper window and the marble date plaque.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The old Eden Presbyterian church, now used by the Ukrainian Orthodox Holy Trinity congregation, stands on the south side of Circle Road in the small village of Whaleyville, Worcester County, Maryland. The single story rectangular frame structure faces north with the gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built in 1856, the asbestos shingled frame church is supported by a concrete block foundation, and it is covered by a steeply pitched asphalt shingle roof. Rising from the top of the church is a pyramidal roofed belfry. Associated with the church and standing behind it is a two-story frame parsonage. (See WO-282)

The north (main) elevation is a symmetrical three-bay facade with a center entrance and flanking six-over-six sash windows. Although the front door has been replaced the entrance is highlighted by an intact classical surround with paneled pilasters, a paneled frieze, and a stepped molding under the cornice. The transom has been covered. Originally the corners of the church were defined by pilasters; the capitals of which remain. The pedimented gable end is pierced by an original six-over-six sash window framed by a fluted surround with plain corner blocks. The top sash has a slightly segmental arch. Directly below the window is a framed date plaque inscribed "Eden Presbyterian Church, Erected A. D. 1856.

The east and west sides of the church are pierced by three large size six-over-six sash windows trimmed with a pointed arch pediment decoration. Above the windows, the eave is trimmed by a boxed cornice. The back of the building is a plain gable end wall with a pedimented top.

The interior was not seen.

The old Eden Presbyterian church in Whaleyville is one of a small collection of Greek Revival style rural churches in Worcester County. Dated to 1856, the building is oriented to face north with a pedimented front elevation. Despite a sheathing of asbestos shingles and removal of the corner pilasters, the church retains a significant degree of integrity with its classically inspired entrance. Important additional features include the classical surround that highlights the entrance, the fluted surround that trims the upper window, and most significantly the marble date plaque.

On June 25, 1856, Peter Whaley and his wife Elizabeth Davis Whaley transferred to the trustees of the newly formed "Eden Presbyterian Church of Whaley Ville" a small tract of land known as "Grays Lot." (JAP 1/147) Located along the road leading east from the main interestion, the lot was improved shortly afterwards by a Greek Revival style frame church. The congregation remained active until the early mid twentieth century when the property was sold finally to a Ukrainian Orthodox congregation.





