The Lyle R. Cropper house is an early twentieth century frame bungalow designed and manufactured by Sears, Roebuck, and Company and then shipped to Ocean City by train. Built around 1915, the frame house has survived relatively unchanged since then, and it exhibits distinctive bungalow style features such as the tapered porch posts and bracketed eaves. Dominating the roof is a large gable dormer that provides light to the second floor rooms. The dormer also features a small balcony.

Construction of this story-and-a-half bungalow is credited to Willard B. Hayman, who purchased this Baltimore Avenue lot in April 1915 from John G. and Ethel M. Scott. At the time the lot sold for \$375, a price that would not have included any substantial improvements. Willard B. Hayman, and his wife, Evelyn, evidently purchased the house parts from Sears, Roebuck, and then financed its construction shortly afterwards. The Haymans retained ownership of their new house for only three years when the couple sold the property to Lyle R. Cropper. The house has remained in Cropper family hands.

The Lyle R. Cropper house stands at 4 Baltimore Avenue in the center of Ocean City, Worcester County, Maryland. The story-and-a-half frame bungalow faces west with the gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built around 1915, the story-and-a-half, three-bay frame house is supported on a raised and rusticated concrete block foundation, and the house is sheathed with asbestos shingles. Covering the medium pitched gable roof is a layer of asbestos shingles.

The west (main) facade is a symmetrical three-bay elevation with a front porch incorporated under the main roof slope. Supported on rusticated, concrete block piers, the porch is distinguished by tapered piers on high, weatherboarded plinths. Paired posts flank the front entrance steps while triple posts support the corners of the porch. Stretching between the plinths is a board railing. The same railing extends down the front steps to the street. The center entrance is flanked by paired single-pane sash windows. Highlighting the roof is a large gabled dormer featuring a center door, flanking windows and a small built-in balcony with a board railing. Similar to the sides of the main block, the eaves to the dormer are extended and underpinned with brackets. A narrow brick stove stack rises through the center of the house.

The south side of the house is an asymmetrical elevation with single pane sash windows lighting the first floor and a paired window piercing the upper gable. The eaves to the roof are extended well beyond the exterior wall, and, like the dormer, have bracketed supports.

The north side is similarly treated with the addition of a bay window.

The interior was not seen.
