The Bethlehem Methodist church is a well preserved early twentieth century frame structure supported on rusticated concrete piers. Similar to many early twentieth century churches, the sanctuary is lighted by pointed arch colored glass windows. The front entrance is enhanced by a colored glass pointed arch transom, and a diamond-shaped window marks the upper gable. Still visible on the diamond window is a faint inscription, "Bethlehem Church 1916."

The Bethlehem Methodist Church stands on the northeast corner of the intersection of Greenbriar Swamp Road and Saint Lukes Road in the western section of Worcester County approximately eight miles northwest of Snow Hill. The church faces south with the gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built around 1916, this single-story gable front frame church is supported on rusticated concrete block piers and the building is sheathed with a layer of plain weatherboards. The steeply pitched gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The south (main) elevation is a symmetrical three-bay facade with a center double door entrance and flanking colored glass windows. The paneled doors are topped by a pointed colored glass transom. The flanking windows are topped by a pointed arch transom as well. Fixed in the upper gable end is a diamond shaped colored glass window that retains a faint white inscription, "Bethlehem Church 1916." The eaves to the roof are slightly extended, and the rafter ends are exposed.

The side elevations are three-bay walls with pointed arch colored glass windows. Interior brick stacks rise through the sides of the church.

The north or rear gable end is marked by a three-sided apse with colored glass windows in two sides. Another diamond shaped window pierces the upper gable.

The interior was not seen.

Standing behind the church is a shed roofed frame privy sheathed with weaterboard siding.


