The Fleming's IGA is a prominent landmark in the center of Stockton. Operated by the Fleming family since the early 1930s, this grocery is the last commercial business to remain active at the crossroads. This site is also the location where the disastrous 1906 fire originated, which burned much of the business district. Newspaper reports relate the fire started on the second floor of the former building on the site, owned at the time by P. E. Wharton & Son. In its place a two-story brick commercial building was erected with the expected hope of preventing another devastating fire by using less flammable masonry construction. The Fleming's IGA is a well preserved example of early twentieth-century vernacular commercial architecture.

Fleming's IGA stands on the southwest corner of the intersection MD Route 12 (Snow Hill-Stockton Road) and Md Route 366 (Pocomoke-Stockton Road) in the center of Stockton, Worcester County, Maryland. The two-story, two-bay brick store building faces east.

Built around 1907 (after the November 1906 fire destroyed the business district of Stockton), the two-story seven-course common bond brick commercial building is topped by a long shed roof that extends westward from the front parapet wall. Attached during the 1960s is a single story post office on the south side of the store.

The east (main) elevation is a symmetrical two-bay facade with an intact Victorian storefront. A center entrance is flanked by large plate glass windows supported by paneled knee walls. Atop the main windows are smaller paned windows. Stretching across the entire storefront is decorated Victorian cornice with brackets and sawnwork. Lighting the second floor above are two evenly spaced two-over-two sash windows topped by segmental arches of raised brick. Centered above the second floor windows are small vents. Finishing the top of the store is an intact metal cornice.

The north side of the store is defined by an asymmetrical placement of small and large windows as well as a side door. Each of the openings is topped by a raised brick segmental arch. Iron tie-rods with star-shaped anchors are spotted along the wall.

The south side is partially covered by the single-story brick post office. Otherwise the side wall is finished in a similar manner as the north wall.

The interior has been remodeled through the years.


