**Description of Property and Eligibility Determination:** *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The village of Stockton is located along the crossroads of Route 12 (Snow Hill Road) and Route 366 (George Island Landing Road) in Worcester County, Maryland.

“ Situated on an elevated ridge of land a few miles west of Chincoteague Bay, the crossroads village of Stockton has been a principal trading center for southeastern Worcester County for the past century and a half. While most of the town's growth and development is tied to the nineteenth century, one of the earliest events associated with the area occurred at the time of the Revolutionary War. In 1774 the Maryland General Assembly approved a levy of tobacco for the creation of a chapel of ease for All Hallows Parish at a place called “Sandy Hill.” The chapel of the ease was later consecrated the Chapel of the Holy Cross.” Quoted from Paul Baker Touart, Along the Seaboard Side: The Architectural History of Worcester County, Maryland. (Worcester County Commissioners, 1994) page 309.

Other significant developments in Stockton (as it later came to be called) occurred in the last quarter of the nineteenth century and then on into the first quarter of the twentieth century (1876 – 1918). The Wilmington and Baltimore Railroad came to Sandy Hill in 1876 with a depot identified as “Hursley Station.” With it came a significant building campaign for commercial and private residential structures. Many of these sites are currently listed in the Maryland Inventory of Historic Properties.

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
Some of them include: The William Sturgis House (1868) WO- 378; The Wesley United Methodist Church (1870 & 1914) WO-379; The Dr. John T. Parker House (1873) WO-376; The Gunby Presbyterian Church (1877) WO-450; The Chapel of the Holy Cross (1850 & 1887) WO-55; The William O. Payne House (1890) WO-377; 5548 Stockton Road (late 1890's) WO-528.

The Stockton Bank (WO-49) was constructed in 1902 and was said to have been the only building that was spared the flames of the great fire of 1906 that destroyed most of the town's business district. (Unfortunately, the bank building was destroyed in 1983.) Following the fire, the Town invested in rebuilding many of the commercial structures. Brick construction materials were employed and many buildings remain intact today. These include: P.E. Wharton & Sons/Fleming's IGA (1906) WO-381; The A.C. Hancock Department Store (1907) WO-382; 5627 George Island Landing Road (ca.1910); and 1435 Snow Hill Road (1910) WO-529. Also built during this time, but since demolished, were such buildings as The Melvin Burbage's Grocery Store/The Burbage Building (1906) WO-380 and 1536 St. Paul Street WO-530. Other residential construction continued during the early part of the twentieth century with traditional vernacular forms of architecture, including modest shingle style structures, varied forms of American foursquares, as well as more traditional 'I' house forms. Most of these structures are representative of this burgeoning residential development around this growing country village. (Many of these structures are not included in the Maryland Inventory of Historic Properties.) These properties are extant primarily along Rte 366 west of the business district and to a lesser extent along the eastern portions of the road. They are also evident to a lesser extent along Snow Hill Road. (See map reference for approximate boundary lines and related photos.) While many of these structures have been modified over the years (i.e. aluminum or asbestos siding has covered original finishes, roof materials have been changed) generally these buildings read as contributing structures to the intact village setting.

The whole collection of buildings exhibit distinctive architectural characteristics that indeed reflect a period in time, as well as valuable methods of construction and workmanship. While several of the town's local landmarks have been lost, (most particularly the Stockton Bank building and The Burbage building) and while there has been some infill, it is not pronounced. Together, the extant structures read as a cohesive country village that may be recommended for listing as a Historic District in the National Register of Historic Places.


